

Nampa Public School Home Learning Plan

Lesson delivery will begin on **Monday, April 6, 2020**

- Student learning packages can be picked up starting April 6 and every Monday thereafter.

In order to minimize the number of people on site, we ask that parents pick up student learning packages on Mondays according to the following schedule:

- Grades K-2: 9:00 - 10:00 a.m.
- Grades 3-4: 10:00 - 11:00 a.m.
- Grades 5-6: 11:00 - 12:00 p.m.
- If you have children in multiple grades, you may choose one of these times that best suits your needs.
- If you are unable to pick up your child's package during these times we will be open until 3:30 p.m. and you can pick up your child's package during the afternoon.
- For the remainder of the week, we ask that parents please phone ahead for an appointment before coming to the school.

Parents are asked to please use the **main entrance** when entering and exiting the building and all student learning packages will be available in our gymnasium. Staff will be on hand to assist you.

Please remember that student learning materials are not to be returned to the school. Marking keys, where appropriate, will be included in your child's learning package. School materials such as textbooks will be signed out to students and are to be kept at home until students return to school.

Teachers will connect with parents/students at a minimum once per week to provide an overview of learning for the week and will maintain ongoing and regular contact with students and parents.

Your child's teacher will be available during the regularly scheduled teaching day. If you or your child have questions, your child's teacher will be available to answer these questions in a timely manner between **8:45 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. and 12:45 - 3:30 p.m.** on all instructional days.

Communication will be conducted by way of phone calls, email, google meet, and google classroom. Families and teachers will discuss preferred means of communication.

If parents have concerns, they should contact the classroom teacher to discuss the concern. If the concern is not resolved, parents are then asked to contact the school administrator.

Students should access learning activities and resources on a regular basis (daily) and stay updated on scheduled events and important dates.

Content Delivery

To identify what content needs to be delivered, teachers will evaluate curricular outcomes that have not yet been covered, prioritize remaining essential outcomes based on what is manageable for students working from home, and will plan specific tasks and projects for students.

Content delivery for each grade is broken down as follows as per Alberta Education guidelines:

Kindergarten-Grade 3

- Education content will focus on language/literacy and mathematics/numeracy outcomes of the provincial curriculum.
- Teachers will assign an average of **five hours of work per student per week**, and teachers/support staff will be expected to work with their students and parents on the delivery of these materials.

Grades 4-6

- Education content will continue to focus on language/literacy and mathematics/numeracy outcomes, and where possible incorporate science and social studies outcomes through cross-curricular learning.
- Teachers will assign an average of **five hours of work per student per week**, and will be expected to work with their students and parents on the delivery of these materials.
